At the British Columbia Institute of Technology, you also have to receive a separate undergraduate program to move onto becoming an accountant. The program was made to help set up a potential career in business and receive training from people who work in those specific fields in real life to help you understand their experiences. The program lasts two years and once it's completed you can move on to receive you Bachelor's in Accounting. Requirements that are needed to apply for this program are a math 11 (Foundations or Pre-Calculus), and English 11 and 12. The tuition at BCIT is about \$12,315 for the two year program which is around \$6,157 per year.
