"In the future, let's live together in this house." After 25 years, my mom, still remembers the young man making the promise to her. We interviewed Korean as she is more comfortable speaking in her first language. She says that she can vividly remember the moment when he said those words as he showed his sketchbook to her. The small house surrounded by colourful flowers, drawn onto a piece of paper was so beautiful, but it was the smile of the young man that gave her butterflies. That would have been the day when my mom fell in love with the man. She never knew that the young man she met would be the one to move to Canada with her in the future to keep his promise. She also did not expect that the man would be the one she loves as a husband today.

This love story all goes back to when my mom first went to the States. Her childhood life in Korea wasn't as pleasuring. Although she was the top student in school, her parents didn't have enough money to afford for her to go to post-secondary. Due to the circumstances around her, she enrolled in university a year later graduating from high school. She didn't have a specific dream job at the time, but her thoughts narrowed down to moving out of Korea as she thought it would be better "to get more experience in the outside world" where she had never been.
