




# INNOVATION STATION INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION: THE TELEPHONE




# SOLUTIONS OF THE TELEPHONE TODAY

- WIFI and telephone poles are made for the phone to be wireless and not choppy. Today we can text unlimitedly and take on long phone calls thanks to WIFI. New features have been added to the phone, such as games, a flashlight, and camera so you don't have to worry about the other things.

# 25 YEARS FROM NOW...

- This telephone is about half the size of a laptop, it's very thin. The phone is foldable, meaning you can adjust the size to almost any size you'd like. As the function there's an on/off button, and a home button, very similar to the phones we use today. It's a bigger version of the phone today. Screen protection is extremely strong and waterproof, this is more helpful because it's harder to break.
