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1760 King George III of England begins his reign


George III was a bad king he started a lot of unnecessary taxes, and he started the revolution.

The royal proclamation was issued by George III in 1763 after the the 7 years' war. It was a document of rules for the European's and the aboriginals.




1770 Boston Massacre

British soldiers shot at Americans. It started out as a street fight then escalated quickly between British soldiers and American colonists. This was a very deadly riot.




1773 Boston Tea Party

IN GENERAL CONGRESS ASSEMBLED.

HEN in the Course of human Events, it becomes necessary for one People to diffolve the Political Bands which have conof the Earth, the feperate and equal Station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent Respect to the Opinions of Markind requires that they should declare the Causes which impel them

We hold these Troths to be self-evident, that all Men are created neis .- That to fecure these Rights, Governments are instituted among absolute Rule into these Colonies : Men, deriving their just Powers from the Confent of the Governed, that whenever any Form of Government becomes definedive of thele Ends, altering fundamentally the Forms of our Governments : it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolifh it, and to inflitute new Government, Jaying its foundation on fuch Principles, and organizing its with Power to legislate for us in all Cafes whattoever. Powers in such Form, as to them shall feem most likely to effect their Sufety and Happinels. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments and waging War against us. long eftablished should not be changed for light and transient Causes;

For quartering large Bodies of armed Troops among us : For protecting them, by a mock Trial, from Punishment for any Murnefted them with another, and to assume among the Powers ders which they should commit on the Inhabitants of these States:

For cutting off our Trade with all Parts of the World : For imposing Taxes on us without our Confent :

For depriving us, in many Cafes, of the Benefits of Trial by Jury : For transporting us beyond Seas to be tried for pretended Offences

1776 Washington crosses the Delaware river


Washington was a good leader and it was a surprise attack on the Germans in service for the British.






1778 France allies with America

France and America signed a treaty and it said that they have a mutual agreement not to fight each other and to team up and help each other fight the British.




1781 Surrender of General Cornwallis at Yorktown
