
NORTH-WEST REBELLION TIMELINE

Here's a brief history of what happened during the North-West Rebellion



1884

In the summer of 1884 Louis Riel returned to Canada from exile in the United States. On March 18th Riel was named president.



1885

The Battle of Duck Lake happened on March 26, when a force of about 100 North West Mounted Police and armed citizen volunteers, moved towards Duck Lake under the command of Superintendent Lief Crozier. There ended up being a confusion with the metis and they ended up shooting each other.



1885

- General strange and his troops were resting at Edmonton. They later stopped 18 km northwest of Fort Pitt until they couldn't advance through Cree positions.

They fired at each other for several hours. The last shots were fired at June 3.



A The Metis Bill of Rights was passed in 1870 as part of the Manitoba Act. This gave them more rights and privileges.



1885

On March 25th Canada started the mobilization of troops. They were quickly arranged to be transported across the unfinished gaps of the new railway.





1885

The Battle of Batoche happened on May 10th, when two of Middleton's colonels led an attack on the village of Batoche. Over 25 men were killed and the spirit of resistence was broken.



1885

On November 16th Louis Riel was hung because of treason
